Belgian co to build 132 mln eur compressor station in Turkmenistan

ASHKABAD (Thomson Financial) - Belgium's ENEX Process Engineering has won a contract worth more than 132 mln eur to build a gas compressor plant at the Dovletabat field in southern Turkmenistan, according to a report in official daily Neutralny Turkmenistan.

The agreement should see work start in Feb 2008, and the station should be operational in March 2010.

The Dovletabat field is the point of departure of the Central Asia-Center pipeline, which transports Turkmen gas to Russia, the ex-Soviet Republic's main client.

Turkmenistan has been showing signs of opening up economically to the outside world since the death of Saparmurat Niyazov in Nov 2006.

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ENEX to build gas compressor station at Dovletabat-2 field

The state-run concern Turkmen gas is due to sign a contract with Enex Process Engineering Limited (Hong Kong) for construction of another gas compressor station at Dovletabat-2 gas field.

As the Turkmenistan.ru's correspondent reports referring to the press service of the head of state, Turkmen President Gurbanguly Berdimuhamedov signed a relevant decree.

The cost of the contract totals Euro 132,365 million. The construction should start in February 2008 and be completed in March 2010.

It should be recalled that Enex Process Engineering Limited is a subsidiary of Belgium's Enex Process Engineering.
